Re: Economic & Fiscal Impact Summary of Proposed Agri-Food Innovation

Center - Phoenix, Arizona

Elliott D. Pollack & Company was retained to assess the preliminary economic and fiscal impacts of the proposed Agri-Food Innovation Center in Phoenix, Arizona. As currently conceived, the Agri-Food Innovation Center master plan includes a variety of land uses, including a wholesale foods market, farmers market, research and development office campus and testing fields, a regional park, a convention center, and a hotel.

The following summary outlines a conservative estimate of the impacts of the proposed project. It should be noted that the impacts exclude several components of the plan which will undoubtedly create additional jobs and taxable revenue for the City of Phoenix, including the farmer's market, convention center, and the potential retail sales aspect of the Wholesale Foods Market. In addition, there will be public benefits for local residents that cannot be monetized, such as the regional park and more convenient access to fresh produce.

Economic Impacts

- Construction of the master plan will generate 913 person-years of employment, nearly \$81.1 million in wages, and an estimated \$200.7 million in economic impact throughout the local community and region.
- The commercial operations throughout the Agri-Food Innovation Center, including the wholesale food market, research park, hotel, and additional employment supported by tourists will create at least 1,518 direct jobs, with wages of nearly \$141.1 million and generate an estimated \$385.0 million in economic activity each year. Including the ripple effects of this direct activity, a total of 4,594 jobs, over \$303.2 million in wages, and an estimated \$848.6 million in annual economic activity throughout the region.

Fiscal Impacts

- Construction of the Agri-Food Innovation Center master plan would generate an estimated \$2.4 million in tax revenues for the City of Phoenix, including construction sales tax, use tax, and employee generated revenues.
- After the project is completed, operations of the wholesale food market, research park, hotel, and tourist spending would create over \$3.5 million in ongoing annual tax revenue that would be collected by the City of Phoenix each year at stabilized occupancy. Property taxes, commercial lease taxes, sales tax, and bed tax would be the largest primary revenue sources. The City would also collect taxes from direct, indirect, and induced employees from sales taxes, property taxes, and state shared revenues.
