Film production in the Phoenix metro area decreased slightly in Fiscal Year 1989-90. Overall, there were fewer projects done in the Valley but revenue generated remained almost the same as last year. The approximate amount of revenue for this fiscal year was \$16,762,597.

The City hosted three feature films, twelve television productions and numerous national, regional and local commercials. Foreign still photography assignments continue to increase.

The data for this report is compiled from local and out-of-state production No multiplier is used. Attached are highlights of film and tape activity.

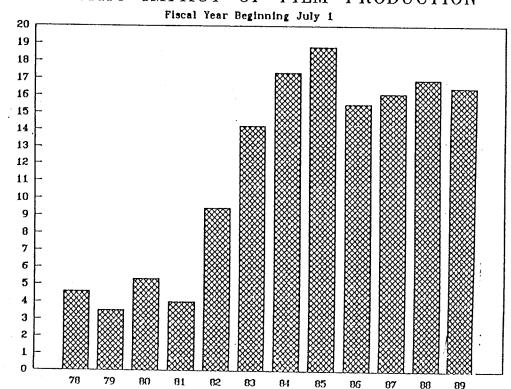

Based on info from our Mayor/Council report, over the last five years \$84,246,176 was left in the Phoenix Metro area from film and tape productions. The figures are from features, television productions (movies, series, etc.), commercials, industrials, educational and still photo assignments.

During that time Phoenix hosted two tv series, 14 features, 11 tv movies, 1 tv mini series, numerous tv segments for weekly programs, 1435 commercials (local, regional and national) and numerous industrial and still photo assignments.
