

Gross revenues for fiscal 1998-99 hit \$45,633,000!

The Phoenix Film Office worked on over 500 projects (including film, video, television, commercials, and stills) this past year and production continues to grow at a steady pace. Production companies know that when they come to Phoenix, they can count on a variety of locations, crews that work hard for them, a growing talent pool and, of course, the sunshine.

I would be remiss if I did not mention the ever-increasing problem of runaway production which concerns every film commission in the United States. Canada, Mexico and Australia continue to lure production companies to their shores by offering them tax incentives and rebates amounting to one-third of their total budget. Since a production company's goal is the "bottom line" these are lures too tempting to ignore.

Film industry organizations such as the Director's Guild of America, Screen Actors Guild, International Alliance of Theatrical & Stagehand Employees and Film US (made up of US film commissioners) are spearheading initiatives at the federal level to address this major industry exodus.

This figure is compiled by out-of-state and local production companies, no multiplier is used. Attached is a copy highlighting film activity.
