




Phoenix hosted 380 film projects in fiscal year 2000-2001 with revenues reaching over \$33,800,000!

This year the Film Office partnered with the Phoenix Film Festival for its inaugural event. The festival exceeded everyone's expectations with over three thousand people attending. The Phoenix Film Festival brought together the best of our local production industry, embraced the international film community and established Phoenix as a future film destination.

Last year the film industry suffered the repercussions of the Screen Extras Guild strike primarily affecting commercial production. The industry also had to withstand the Writer's Guild strike, which while shortlived had a serious impact on feature film and television production. This, along with the continued effects of "runaway" production to film friendly countries like Canada, Australia and Mexico where tax incentives and favorable exchange rates have severely impacted the U.S. production industry in recent years, accounts for this year's decrease.

We are optimistic about next fiscal year as we are already off to a good start hosting 3 feature films this summer. This figure is compiled by information supplied by out-of-state and local production companies. No multiplier is used. Attached is a copy highlighting film activity.
